- Bring MSI to committed levels
- Increase water and waste water funding
- Include municipal projects in Building Canada provincial funding

Transportation and Public Transit



Provincial Transportation Plan

(road, rail, air, transit, active transportation)

- Engage municipalities in planning and monitoring
- Balance economic, social and environmental outcomes
- Address legislative/regulatory barriers
- Link to land use planning
- Incorporate small airports strategy
- Adequately fund and set performance milestones



Transportation pledges



- \$16 million over two years for rural bus services
- \$330 million over three years for municipal transit
- \$119 million over five years for revitalized Strategic Transportation Infrastructure Program (includes roads, bridges, and municipal airports)
- \$150 million for the Edmonton LRT to match federal funding
